Field Day (Message from Ms. Felizberto): It's that time of year again. Field day(s) have been scheduled for the end of May / beginning of June. Wednesday, May 31 will be field day for grades 4 thru 8. There will also be a school wide cookout held on this day. (Calling all chefs!!) The cookout will be held even if it rains on this date. We will eat in the school cafeteria instead of outside. Thursday, June 1 will be field day for grades PreS thru 3. We will also host the DELS lemonade truck on this day. If it rains, DELS will still come on June 1. Should the weather not cooperate, the rain dates for the activities will be June 7 for grades 4 thru 8 and June 8 for PreS thru grade 3. Please note that the activities for the kids may be postponed because of the weather, but the cookout (5/31) and DELS (6/1) remain on the original days.

If you would like to volunteer on those days, please note that you must have completed the Essential Three Process (CORI, Code of Conduct & Safe Environment Training) in order to volunteer. - 4) Please remember that if your student has a fever or vomiting, they must remain home for 24 hours, and must be symptom free.

If you wish, you may deliver **individually packaged snacks** to be served at snack time or at a time determined by the teacher and at the Principal's discretion.
